It is amazing to believe that I have only two more years until accomplish my dream of becoming a Registered Nurse. The hard work I have put into school has obviously paid off because I have now been accepted into the Mount Hood Community College Nursing Program. Now the fun begins! Regarding college classes, I plan on taking classes that will apply to my bachelors until spring, which is when my program will begin. After I graduate at the end of summer 2006, I want to transfer to OHSU for my bachelors and possibly my masters. Although I am not certain which field of nursing I want to have my career, I have been interested in becoming an instructor.

Fortunately, this year I have had some of my school paid for through scholarships....Thank you Corbett Education Foundation. I know that the financial support I have received the last two years has directly helped me with my 3.9 GPA. By having a reduction in my school bill, I do not have to worry about the finances of my education, but instead, I just have to worry about the next exam (which is more than enough)! While going to school full time, I have continued to work part time as a Certified Hospital Technician at Mt. Hood Medical Center which has been an awesome opportunity for hands on experience. By working at the hospital I have not only learned so much, but also it has reinforced my desire to become a Registered Nurse.

In addition to work and school, volunteer work has always been an important part of my life. Since August of 2002 I have been a member of the Neighborhood Emergency Response Team. I have been trying to take advantage of summer (when I'm not sleeping) by hiking, swimming, playing volleyball and doing two of my newest hobbies of mountain biking and fishing. I also plan on doing volunteer work with the organizations I am involved – since during school I cannot be as active. Even though it has been a great accomplishment to finish my sophomore year at Mt. Hood Community College with a 3.9 GPA, the steep hill of the Nursing Program is just ahead and I do not plan on slowing down. I want to thank you for offering this scholarship to current college students and I think that it is so wonderful that the Corbett Education Foundation is continuing to increase the number of scholarships by calling on members of the community to donate. I attended the Corbett graduation ceremony this last year and I want to show my appreciation and congratulate you for all the scholarships that have been given.
